Remember Riverdale-Porterdale on Georgia Gives Day November 13

On the heels of great success in 2012, the GEORGIA CENTER FOR NONPROFITS (GCN) is kicking off its second annual Georgia Gives Day on Wednesday, November 13, 2013. This online fundraiser will benefit partic-

ipating local nonprofits across the state, as Georgians come together for a 24-hour day of giving.

Georgia Gives Day brings the state together as one community to help build capacity for local charities throughout Georgia. In 2012, the inaugural Georgia Gives Day brought more than 1,300 participating nonprofits together with nearly 7,000 unique donors in one day of giving via the Georgia Gives Day website. Personal Profile: Bragg Imilh

In an amazing act of courage and selflessness, local citizen Bragg Smith died on September 30, 1903, trying to save the life of another. The scene was Eleventh Street, where ground was being excavated for sewer lines. City Engineer and Public Services Director Robert L. Johnson was overseeing the work, when the trench suddenly caved in, completely burying him. Bragg Smith, a 32 year old laborer, jumped in to save Johnson, but both men ultimately perished.

Smith was buried in Porterdale Cemetery. As a means of demonstrating the admiration of the general public for his act of bravery, the City of Columbus installed a marble shaft above the grave, bearing the inscription, "Honor and fame from no condition rise. Act well your part, there all the honor lies." At that time and for many years afterward, Columbus was said to be the only city in the United States where the local government erected a monument honoring a black man.

An Historic Marker describing this incident was originally placed on Tenth Avenue near the Porterdale entrance, but was moved in 2012 to Victory Drive across from Porterdale. Hopefully, the marker can make a final move to a location where more people can easily and safely read it and be educated and inspired by Bragg Smith's heroism.

The text of the historic marker reads:

HERO'S MEMORIAL

North of this marker in the Porterdale Cemetery is the grave of Bragg Smith over which the City of Columbus erected a marble memorial to commemorate an outstanding deed of heroism. The text reads: "Erected by the City of Columbus to mark the resting place of Bragg Smith, who died on September 30, 1903, in the heroic but fruitless effort to rescue the city engineer from a caving excavation on Eleventh Street. 'Honor and fame from no condition rise. Act well your part, there all the honor lies.'"

Personal Rofile Update

P.S. Our June, 2008 newsletter included a 'Personal Profile' on Dr. Roland Bird Daniel, who is buried in Riverdale. It described his distinguished career as Superintendent of the Columbus Public Schools as well as his national recognition in the field of secondary school vocational education.

His granddaughter, Ann Cox Strub, read the article and also read about the Riverdale-Porterdale Cemetery Foundation's efforts to erect columns at the entrances and exits of all three cemeteries. She made a significant contribution in honor of Dr. Daniel to build a pair of columns at Riverdale. At the exit drive, bronze plaques now bear the following inscription:

> Given in loving memory of Dr. Roland Bird Daniel Superintendent of Columbus Public Schools from 1909 to 1937 by his daughter the late Evelyn Cox Daniel and his granddaughter Ann Cox Strub 2008

An artist of some note, Mrs. Strub and her husband, Richard L. Strub, M.D., divide their time between New Orleans in winter and Cashiers, NC, in the summer. Her generosity did not stop with the columns. She has also given a handsome portrait of Dr. Daniel which hangs in the museum area of the Riverdale Building.

Now there's another link in this relationship chain: our former Board member Barbara Peebles was employed by the Columbus Public Schools to work in the office of Dr. Daniel immediately following her accelerated graduation from high school. Seeing his portrait displayed recently in the cemetery office brought memories of that first job, when Barbara put to good use her talents at shorthand and typing in the Superintendent's office, then located in the basement of the Columbus Public Library on upper Broadway near Mott's Green. Barbara worked there for two years, and found Dr. Daniel to be a wonderful boss and truly a gentleman.

How fortunate we are to have all these treasures!

Organized in February, 2012, The Dales Society seeks to promote and further the mission of the Foundation, as stated on the membership application form:
