Hallowed Jewish Grounds

Shortly after the establishment of Riverdale Cemetery in 1890, the congregation of B'nai Israel submitted an initial installment of fifty dollars by its treasurer, Mr. H. Sternberg for purchase of part of Section 2, as noted in the actions of Council for October 8, 1891. At this time a committee of the congregation was appointed to name the streets in this section; members included Mrs. Blatt (wife of Rabbi Joseph Blatt), Mr. David Rothschild and Mrs. Daisy Frank. A few years later the congregation, by then known as Temple Israel, installed fencing around the perimeter. The area includes Sternberg Rest, where services are held each year during the High Holy Days, Rosh Hashanah to Yom Kippur. Since its early beginning, maintenance in this section has been handled - beautifully handled—by a representative of the Temple Israel congregation.

The Shearith Israel Congregation owns two other sections in Riverdale. One of these, at the northeast corner of the cemetery, is flanked by a brick wall and wrought iron gate, crested by an arch given by Mr. and Mrs. Richard A. Grifenhagen in 1987. Nearby is the Kravtin Garden, dedicated in 1997 to the memory of Maurice Kravtin. These two areas are also maintained by their congregation.

Laurette Rothschild Rosenstrauch worked with Historic Columbus Foundation and Historic Chattahoochee Commission to gather and organize information for an historic marker commemorating these Jewish Sections. The marker was presented and dedicated in 2008 by her daughter and son, following her death.

These funds have supported events in the cemeteries, reprinting the foundation's brochure, and landscape renovations and security measures. The Society will become engaged in educational activities, particularly genealogical research opportunities for families of those buried in the three cemeteries.


